Exhibitors staging numbers will be forwarded ONLY if a stamped addressed envelope is included with the entry form. Otherwise they should be collected from the Horticultural Secretary on the morning of the show (see rule 3).

Please note: All exhibits must be staged by 10am on the morning of the show and may not be removed before 5pm.

ALL PERSONS ENTERING THE SHOWGROUND MUST PAY THE ENTRY FEE. This will be refunded if you leave the showground before 10am.

Trophies & special prizes will be presented at 4.30pm in the Horticultural Marquee, & all prize money will be paid out immediately after the presentation, & before 6pm on show day. Any monies not collected by 6pm will be forfeited.

Given Recipes

Class 80 Quick Madeira Cake

Ingredients

175g butter (Butter softened, plus extra for greasing)
175g golden caster sugar 3 large eggs
grated zest 1 lemon few drops vanilla extract
200g self-raising flour 50g ground almond

Heat oven to 170C/150C fan/gas 3. Butter and line the base of a 900g loaf tin with greaseproof paper. Using an electric whisk, beat together the butter and sugar until light and creamy then beat in the eggs one at a time. Add the lemon zest and vanilla. Now beat in the flour and almonds until you have a thick batter. The batter should be loose enough that it falls off a wooden spoon, if it's too thick mix in a splash of milk.

Tip the batter into the tin and smooth over the top. Bake for 55 mins – 1hr until a skewer inserted in the middle comes out clean. Remove from the oven then leave to cool for 15 mins then remove from the tin, peel away the paper and leave on a wire rack to cool completely before slicing. The loaf will keep in an airtight container for three days.

83 Ginger Cake

Ingredients

175g plain flour, sifted	1 level tablespoon ground ginger
1 level dessertspoon ground cinnamon	¼ nutmeg, grated
½ level teaspoon bicarbonate of soda	2 tablespoons milk
75g black treacle	75g golden syrup
75g dark brown soft sugar	75g block butter
1 large egg, lightly beaten	

Line a 2lb loaf tin with a liner. Sift the flour and spices into a large bowl, then mix the bicarbonate of soda with the milk and set it on one side. Now measure the black treacle, golden syrup, sugar and butter into a saucepan with 75ml of water, heat and gently stir until thoroughly melted and blended.

Next add the syrup mixture to the flour and spices, beating vigorously with a wooden spoon, and when the mixture is smooth, beat in the egg a little at a time, followed by the bicarbonate of soda and milk.

Now pour the mixture into the prepared tin and bake on a lower shelf so that the top of the tin is aligned with the centre of the oven for 1¼–1½ hours until it's well-risen and firm to the touch. Remove the cake from the oven and allow to cool in the tin for 5 minutes before turning out. Remove liner when cold.

RULES:

1: This section shall be governed by a sub-committee elected by the members of the Society in General Meeting each year and in accordance with the Rules of the Society.

2: Every exhibit must be the bone-fide property of and grown by the exhibitor or made and produced by the exhibitor with the exception of classes 64-69, & 152. This rule will be strictly enforced and exhibitors infringing this rule will be disqualified, and all entry fees & prize money will be forfeited.

3: Specimens forming part of a collective may NOT be exhibited in any other class.

4: The prize money will be awarded at the discretion of the committee in conjunction with the judge, & the right is reserved to alter or withdraw any prizes if sufficient merit has not been shown, or if sufficient merit is not forthcoming or otherwise, at their absolute discretion.

5: No exhibitor shall be allowed to take home more than 1 prize in any 1 class.

6: The committee reserve the right to inspect any garden at any time, and they have the power to refuse any entry.

7: If there are fewer than 5 entries in any one class, the 3rd prize money may be withheld.

8: The decision of the Committee and the judge should be final as to merit. Any objection may be made in writing to the secretary, by 2pm on the day of the show, and must be accompanied by a deposit of £5 which will be refunded if the objection is sustained.

9: Specimens for exhibition must be staged before 10am prompt on the day of the show. Specimens sent after this time will be rejected. The tent will be cleared for judging and re-open at 12.30pm approx. No exhibit may be removed before 5pm.

10: Competitors must bring their own vases, plates etc. for staging their own exhibits. The sub-committee will not be responsible for any loss or damage, but every care will be taken of all such equipment.

11: Trade exhibits: Items may be sold from exhibits which form part of a display & collected after 5pm.

12: All entries must be made on the Society's form and must be accompanied by declaration signed by the competitor in accordance with Rule 2. Entry fee(s) must be paid at the time of entry. No entry will be taken after the closing date shown on the schedule. entries not recorded on the judge's slip will be disqualified from that particular class. Closing date will be one week before the show.

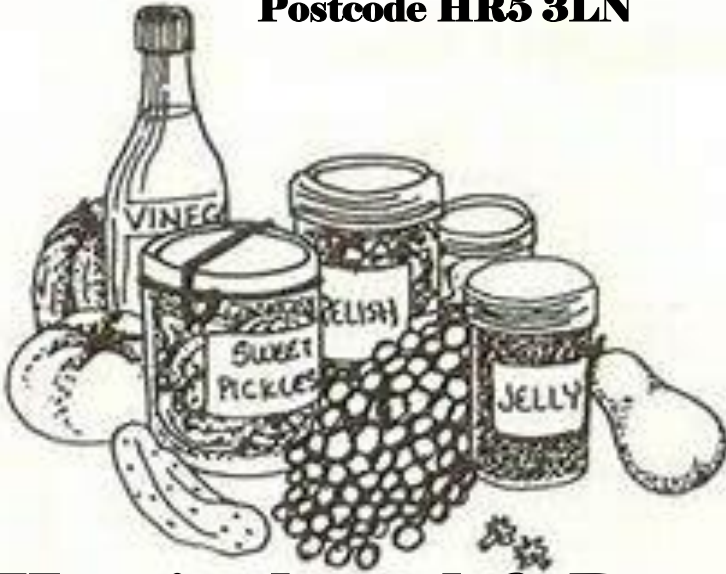
13: Exhibitors making entries to the value of £10 & over will be issued with an exhibitor's pass for the showground, which is to be collected from the secretary along with the staging numbers on the morning of the show.

14: Exhibitors may indicate that their exhibits are for sale, but the committee may not take part in any negotiations.

15: The points towards trophies will be awarded as follows: Three for 1st, two for 2nd & one for 3rd, when applicable.
