

GENERAL INFORMATION

Schedules & entry forms can be found on the Kington Show website - www.kingtonshow.co.uk & from various outlets including the Grapevine, the Kington Tourist Information Office and the Kington NFU Office. Entries must be made to the Secretary or they may be received at the Kington NFU Office.

Exhibitors staging numbers will be forwarded ONLY if a stamped addressed envelope is included with the entry form. Otherwise, they should be collected from the Horticultural Secretary on the morning of the show.

Please note: All exhibits must be staged by 10am on the morning of the show and may not be removed before 5pm.

ALL PERSONS ENTERING THE SHOWGROUND MUST PAY THE ENTRY FEE. This will be refunded if you leave the showground before 10am.

Trophies & special prizes will be presented at 4.30pm in the Horticultural Marquee & all prize money will be paid out immediately after the presentation and before 6pm on show day. Any monies not collected by 6pm will be forfeited

Given Recipe

Class 63: Fruit slice 'Fly Pie'

Ingredients

300g Plain Flour 150 g butter chilled 50g Icing sugar 1 egg Cold water

Filling

200g currants 75g brown sugar 50g butter softened 1 tsp mixed spice

Oven 180 or 160 for fan oven or gas 4

Grease a 20x28cm baking tray with a little butter. In a large bowl, using your fingers, rub the flour and butter together until it resembles breadcrumbs. Stir through the sugar before adding the egg. Mix until combined, adding cold water as required and knead into a soft pastry dough. Wrap in cling film and place in the fridge to cool.

In a bowl mix the currants, sugar, butter and mixed spice until combined.

Remove the pastry from the fridge and roll to 0.5cm thickness and cut into two large rectangles, about the size of your baking tray. Place one pastry rectangle onto your prepared tray. Spoon the currant mixture evenly on to the pastry on the baking tray leaving a small gap around the edge. Wet the edges with a little water. Place the other sheet of pastry on top of the currants and gently press the edges together with your fingers before finishing with a fork.

Brush the top with a little milk or beaten egg, before pricking a few holes on the top of the pastry.

Bake for 25-30 minutes until a light golden brown.

Remove from the oven and sprinkle a bit of caster sugar on top to finish. When completely cool, cut in to squares.

RULES:

- 1: This section shall be governed by a sub-committee elected by the members of the Society in General Meeting each year and in accordance with the Rules of the Society.
- 2: Every exhibit must be the bone-fide property of and grown by the exhibitor or made and produced by the exhibitor with the exception of classes 46-51. This rule will be strictly enforced and exhibitors infringing this rule will be disqualified, and all entry fees & prize money will be forfeited.
- 3: Specimens forming part of a collective may NOT be exhibited in any other class.
- 4: The prize money will be awarded at the discretion of the committee in conjunction with the judge & the right is reserved to alter or withdraw any prizes if sufficient merit has not been shown, or if sufficient merit is not forthcoming or otherwise, at their absolute discretion.
- 5: No exhibitor shall be allowed to take home more than 1 prize in any 1 class.
- 6: The committee reserve the right to inspect any garden at any time, and they have the power to refuse any entry.
- 7: If there are fewer than 5 entries in any one class, the 3rd prize money may be withheld.
- 8: The decision of the Committee and the judge should be final as to merit. Any objection may be made in writing to the secretary, by 2pm on the day of the show, and must be accompanied by a deposit of £5 which will be refunded if the objection is sustained.

- 9: Specimens for exhibition must be staged before 10am prompt on the day of the show. Specimens sent after this time will be rejected. The tent will be cleared for judging and re-open at 12.30pm approx. No exhibit may be removed before 5pm.
- 10: Competitors must bring their own vases, plates etc. for staging their own exhibits. The sub-committee will not be responsible for any loss or damage, but every care will be taken of all such equipment.
- 11: Trade exhibits: Items may be sold from exhibits which form part of a display & collected <u>after</u> 5pm.
- 12: All entries can be made on the enclosed entry form or by email horti.domestic.kingtonshow@gmail.com, stating name, age (if under 18), address and no. & name of the classes entered.
- 13: Exhibitors may indicate that their exhibits are for sale, but the committee may not take part in any negotiations.
- 14: The points towards trophies will be awarded as follows: Three for 1st, two for 2nd & one for 3rd, when applicable.
