Vaccinations – Spot checks of vaccination certificates will be carried out at random on show day! **Cattle:**

Vaccinated against Bovine Viral Diarrhoea (BVD), Leptospirosis, Clostridial diseases, and Johne's Disease. **Sheep:**

Vaccinate against Clostridial diseases (e.g., Tetanus, Enterotoxaemia), and consider Bluetongue vaccination (if relevant). **Horses:** Vaccinated against Equine Influenza and Tetanus. Parasite Control: Administer appropriate

treatments for internal and external parasites (e.g., worms, lice, ticks)

PLEASE READ

ALL Rings will commence at **8:30AM**. A list of the number of entries in each class will be published after the entries have been closed with **APPROXIMATE TIMES** for classes, unless already stated in the schedule. Please note, these times are **APPROXIMATE TIMES ONLY** and are subject to change.

PLEASE NOTE – The space outside the rings in the main ring is a **HORSE WALK ONLY** and **NOT A WARM UP AREA OR COLLECTING RING**. Warm ups must be done in the warm up area by the lorry park before coming down to the ring just before your class time please.

HORSES & PONIES MUST WALK ONLY IN THE COLLECTING RINGS & HORSE WALKS. Collecting rings will be restricted to horses and ponies waiting for the next class to commence and no more.

PLEASE LEAVE IMMEDIATELY VIA THE HORSE WALK AFTER YOUR CLASS, UNLESS YOU ARE LUCKY ENOUGH TO BE WAITING FOR A CHAMPIONSHIP.

Spectators & Owners not exhibiting must watch from **OUTSIDE** of the main ring.

ONLY THE HANDLER/RIDER, AND GROOM/PARENT (Groom/Parent must have a wristband) WILL BE ALLOWED ENTRY TO ANY OF THE COLLECTING RINGS, WARM UP, HORSE WALKS AND SHOWING RINGS.

STRICTLY No dogs, unaccompanied children, mobility scooters or pushchairs will be allowed in the horse areas.

THESE ARE ALL SAFETY PRECAUTIONS FOR PEOPLE AND HORSES AND WE THANK YOU FOR YOUR CO-OPERATION!

Verbal or physical abuse to any animal or person **WILL NOT** be tolerated. You will be asked to leave the showground immediately and banned from entering any future classes at Kington Show. Competitors, judges, stewards and spectators are asked to report any abusive behaviour as soon as possible.

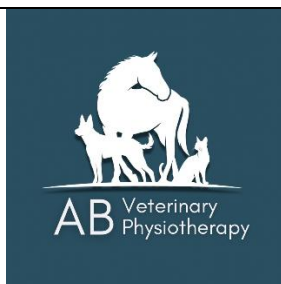

<u>Class 24</u> Frist Ridden Pony 13 hands (133cm) and under, ridden by a child 12 years and under. Snaffle bridle must be worn. Canter will be required in individual shows. Ponies may be shown plaited or unplaited.
<u>Class 25</u> Child's Riding Pony For ponies 14.2 hands (148cm) and under, ridden by a child 16 years and under. Any suitable bridle may be worn. Ponies may be shown plaited or unplaited.
<u>Class 26</u> Best Rider For ponies 15 hands (153cm) and under, ridden by a child 18 years and under. Any suitable bridle may be worn. Ponies may be shown plaited or unplaited. This class will be judged on rider ability while riding throughout the class.
<u>KINGTON SHOW UNAFFILIATED RIDDEN SHOWING CHAMPIONSHIP</u> 1st & 2nd Prize winners from classes 23 - 26 are eligible for this championship

NPS SHOWING CLASSES

OPEN TO NPS MEMBERS & NON MEMBERS WITH QUALIFICATIONS GOING TO HIGHEST PLACED NPS MEMBER. PRIZE MONEY FOR CLASSES 27 - 32 First £20; Second £12; Third £7 Classes to be held in accordance with NPS Competition Rules.
Summer Qualifying Rounds: These classes are judged under the Rules of the NPS. Ponies must be registered in any of the British Riding Pony studbook sections or the Ridden Register; the GSB; the AHSB; the AASB, or registered in the main body of their respective M&M Stud Book. Part bred are not eligible unless over stamped into one of the British Riding Pony studbook sections. or the Ridden Register. Qualifying rounds for most NPS competitions are open to ponies owned by NPS members and non-members but only ponies owned by adult NPS Qualifying or Life



members are eligible to qualify for the final of the competition at the NPS Summer Championship Show at Malvern August 2027.

The highest placed pony, if owned by an NPS member, in each class will qualify for the final. Qualification may pass down to third place if the first and second ponies are already qualified. NB: **For Winter Qualifiers** Non-Members will need to become members to enter the finals at the NPS Spring Festival 2027. The three highest placed ponies, not already qualified, within the first six places, will qualify. Winnings in the 2026/2027 Novice and Pure Novice Winter Championships will not debar ponies from the NPS 2027 Mountain and Moorland Novice Ridden competitions. Qualification cards will be awarded in the ring.

NPS/WTJ Insurance Brokers Ltd Home Produced Ridden Championship - Riders of Home Produced ponies (see definition in the NPS Rules Book) can wear a white arm band in classes where this is indicated. These ponies, if owned by NPS members, are then eligible to qualify for the final at the NPS Summer Championship Show. The Owner's Membership cards **MUST** be produced in the ring when requested or the qualification will be forfeit.

IN HAND M&M CHAMPIONSHIP Champions from all M&M in hand classes are eligible for this championship. HIGHEST PLACED NPS MEMBER OF THIS CHAMPIONSHIP WILL WIN THE NPS/BLACKERTOR & SHARPTOR STUDS M&M IN HAND SILVER MEDAL. NPS Silver Medal Rosettes are only awarded when the owner of the champion pony is a Qualifying or Life member of the NPS. A valid membership card must be in the rider's/handler's possession on entering the ring and be produced immediately on request by either the judge or the steward. If the owner of the Champion pony is not a member, or the owner's membership card is not immediately produced, the rosette may be awarded to the Reserve Champion provided they have the required membership card. If the Champion pony has previously qualified it is still entitled to the Silver Medal Rosette, but the qualification card goes to the Reserve Champion pony, provided the owner of that pony is a member of the NPS. The Silver Medal Rosette and the qualification card can be awarded no lower than first Reserve (third). Foals are not eligible to be awarded the Silver Medal.

1. Classes must be confined to SPS-BS Registered Ponies. Ponies must be named on the entry form and in the catalogue if one is produced. Society rosettes must only be given to ponies registered with the Society or to foals eligible for registration
2. Three-year-old fillies with foals at foot may not be shown.
All foals must be a minimum of three weeks old on the day of the Show.
3. IN ORDER TO ENTER A STALLION CLASS AT AN AFFILIATED SHOW, ENTIRE MALES AGED 4 YEARS AND OVER MUST HAVE AN "S" NUMBER AND HAVE BEEN SUCCESSFULLY THROUGH EITHER THE SPS-BS STALLION ASSESSMENT PRIOR TO 2006 OR THE CURRENT SPSBS VOLUNTARY VETERINARY EXAMINATION. Ridden stallions MUST display a stallion bridle badge. In-hand entire males 2 years and over are advised to display a stallion bridle badge.
4. There must be no colts or entire males in Young Handlers classes. Children under 14 years old may not show colts (excluding foals) or entire males in In-hand classes. Children under 12 years old on the day of the show may not show entire males in ridden classes. In the interests of safety, hard hats must be worn by all handlers aged 14 years or under in In-hand classes. Exhibitors should not kneel but remain standing while in the ring. Hard hats must be worn by all exhibitors, irrespective of age, in ridden classes. **Ridden or driven ponies must be 4yrs old or over.** In ridden Classes, if a rider falls off at any time whilst in the ring, both pony and rider must leave the ring, rider dismounted, and take no further part.

Some classes may be amalgamated if insufficient entries are received.

No Miniature Shetlands may enter the Standard classes.

Prize money will be paid by BACS direct to your bank account during the week following the show. The winner and runner up in each class will be asked to join the Grand Parade at approx. 2.30pm. if classes have finished in time. Horses can be any height, riders any age.

SHOW JUMPING RULES

1. The show jumping will run as a 2-phase competition. The first phase is a course of 7-9 obstacles, the second phase takes place over 4-6 obstacles, which will be timed. Competitors who receive faults in the first phase WILL be allowed to continue to the second phase. Individuals with the least number of faults in the quickest time will win. This competition will be run under Pony Club Rules and the judge's decision is final.
2. 3 refusals during any round, across either phase, will result in Elimination and competitors will be asked to leave the area at a walk. A horse and or rider fall will result in immediate elimination.
3. HARD HATS WHICH COMPLY TO THE REQUIRED STANDARDS MUST BE WORN.
4. Organisers reserve the right to merge, cancel or alter any classes depending on advance entries or weather conditions. If there are 5 or less entries in a class, the class may be cancelled by the organisers.
5. No horse/pony to be tied to trailer/lorry and left unattended.
6. Excessive use of the whip, spurs or voice will result in elimination.

The judges' decision is final. Objections must be lodged with the secretary in writing with a non-refundable £10.00 deposit within 30 minutes of the end of the class.

Rules relating to Horses

1. Saddle horses, unless entered for competition, will not be admitted onto the showground.
2. No person shall enter the ring except the riders of horses exhibited, the judges, the president, chairman, stewards and secretary.
3. Hard hats. Anyone riding a horse or pony must wear a hat to British Standard specification and of a standard approved by the governing body of their respective horse or pony society, association or discipline and under whose rules they are exhibiting or competing. This hat must be worn at all times.
4. Organisers reserve the right to merge, cancel or alter any classes depending on advance entries or weather conditions. No horse/pony to be tied to trailer/lorry and left unattended. Excessive use of the whip, spurs or voice will result in elimination. The judges' decision is final. Objections must be lodged with the secretary in writing with a non-refundable £10.00 deposit within 30 minutes of the end of the class.

Riding – no galloping, cantering or trotting outside the arenas.

KINGTON SHOW – RULES

General Rules

1. Accidents. In the event of any accident, the Society should be informed immediately by contacting a steward or show secretary. The Chief Safety Steward will be responsible for investigating the accident and taking any necessary action.
2. First Aid is available throughout the day, situated next to the Secretary's marquee.
3. Dogs must be kept on a lead at all times and are not allowed in the following areas; livestock pens, horse lines, collecting rings or the dining area of the Members' Marquee.
4. All entries must be on the ground by 9:00am - remain at their station until called for by the stewards, return thereto as soon as they have been judged, and not leave the ground until 4:00pm except in case of illness when a certificate from the veterinary surgeons must be lodged with the secretary or one of the stewards.
5. No straw is to be brought onto the Show Ground. Straw will be provided on site. This is to avoid Black Grass contamination.



6. Please ensure that your animal/s have sufficient water for the duration of the day. (Water is available at a number of sites throughout the showground).
7. No animal must be brought to the show if suffering from any infectious or contagious disease: and if one should be brought the whole responsibility shall rest on the owner of such animal, and no claim shall be made against the society for damage caused by such animals.
8. Veterinary surgeons and a farrier are also available throughout the day. See the secretary, who will contact them for you via radio.
9. Transport Safety. The showground operates a 5mph maximum speed limit. If reversing, a signalman must be positioned to the rear of the vehicle. Audible or visual reversing alarms should also be fitted. Always ensure that when unloading takes place members of the public are kept well clear of the area. Loads must be secured at all times.
10. Exhibitor tickets are available for the day of the show. These tickets are not transferable and will be forfeited if lent to anyone under any pretext what-so-ever. These tickets will be sent with instructions before the show opens. To prevent confusion on the show day, subscribers and exhibitors are requested to communicate with the secretary at least 7 days before the show in case their tickets are not in order, as no adjustment can be made on the day, and no one will be allowed to enter the show without a ticket.
11. The judges shall be empowered to withhold any prize in the absence of merit. No third prize will be awarded in any class where there are less than five entries.
12. Disqualification. In case of any prize animal being disqualified, the winner of the next succeeding prize in that class shall take the prize that has been awarded to such disqualified animal, and the lowest prize in the class shall go the reserve number. Should the reserve number succeed to a prize and be itself disqualified, the prize will be forfeited.
13. In the event of the owner or the person in charge of an animal, disputing or refusing the award of the judges, the prize awarded will be forfeited. The decision of the judges shall be final. With regard to an animal, any exhibit or any event.
14. The society shall not be responsible for the incorrectness of any entry.
15. The committee shall have the power to exclude any unruly or vicious animal from the showground.
16. All prize-winners in the livestock and horse sections to parade in the Main Ring when called upon to do so by the stewards.
