Entry to the Showground - Admission to the showground for Livestock entries will be from 7am on the day of the Show unless prior arrangements have been made (see Cattle section).

Please follow the signs on the road for entry to the showground and take instruction from stewards on the showground with regard to unloading and parking.

Bluetongue Virus (BTV-3) Kington Show are continuously monitoring the situation with regards to BTV-3 and will follow guidelines issued from APHA & DEFRA in the coming weeks. Updates will be issued as and when we receive them via our social media pages.

Advice for Livestock Keepers:

- Monitor APHA Updates: Keep abreast of the latest information and guidance from APHA and Defra to ensure compliance with current regulations.
- Apply for Movement Licences Early if applicable: If planning to attend a show, apply for a specific movement licence well in advance, as processing times can vary.
- Vaccination: Consider vaccinating susceptible animals against Bluetongue.

Animal care -

Veterinary Surgeons available on the showground: Arrowfield Veterinary Practice, Kington. Farrier: Rob Duggan

Vaccinations - Spot checks of vaccination certificates will be carried out at random on show day! Cattle:

Vaccinated against Bovine Viral Diarrhoea (BVD), Leptospirosis, Clostridial diseases, and Johne's Disease.

Sheep: Vaccinate against Clostridial diseases (e.g., Tetanus, Enterotoxaemia), and consider Bluetongue vaccination (if relevant). **Horses:** Vaccinated against Equine Influenza and Tetanus. Parasite Control:

Administer appropriate treatments for internal and external parasites (e.g., worms, lice, ticks)

Cattle may be of any breed, sex or age, either family or non-family owned. Judged on handling or showing ability, not on the animal itself or handler's age. Handlers must wear white coats, shirt tie and suitable footwear. Animal to be halter led and handler will be asked rudimentary questions on their animal.

Rosettes will be awarded.

INTERBREED CHAMPION PAIRS – CATTLE

KINGTON SHOW – RULES

General Rules

1. Accidents. In the event of any accident, the Society should be informed immediately by contacting a steward or show secretary. The Chief Safety Steward will be responsible for investigating the accident and taking any necessary action.
2. First Aid is available throughout the day, situated next to the Secretary's marquee.
3. Dogs must be kept on a lead at all times and are not allowed in the following areas: livestock pens, horse lines, collecting rings or the dining area of the Members' Marquee.
4. All entries must be on the ground by 9:00am - remain at their station until called for by the stewards, return thereto as soon as they have been judged, and not leave the ground until 4:00pm except in case of illness when a certificate from the veterinary surgeons must be lodged with the secretary or one of the stewards.
5. No straw is to be brought onto the Show Ground. Straw will be provided on site. This is to avoid Black Grass contamination.
6. Please ensure that your animal/s have sufficient water for the duration of the day. (Water is available at a number of sites throughout the showground).
7. No animal must be brought to the show if suffering from any infectious or contagious disease: and if one should be brought the whole responsibility shall rest on the owner of such animal, and no claim shall be made against the society for damage caused by such animals.
8. Veterinary surgeons and a farrier are also available throughout the day. See the secretary, who will contact them for you via radio.
9. Transport Safety. The showground operates a 5mph maximum speed limit. If reversing, a signalman must be positioned to the rear of the vehicle. Audible or visual reversing alarms should also be fitted. Always ensure that when unloading takes place members of the public are kept well clear of the area. Loads must be secured at all times.

10. Exhibitor tickets are available for the day of the show. These tickets are not transferable and will be forfeited if lent to anyone under any pretext what-so-ever. These tickets will be sent with instructions before the show opens. To prevent confusion on the show day, subscribers and exhibitors are requested to communicate with the secretary at least 7 days before the show in case their tickets are not in order, as no adjustment can be made on the day, and no one will be allowed to enter the show without a ticket.
11. The judges shall be empowered to withhold any prize in the absence of merit. No third prize will be awarded in any class where there are less than five entries.
12. Disqualification. In case of any prize animal being disqualified, the winner of the next succeeding prize in that class shall take the prize that has been awarded to such disqualified animal, and the lowest prize in the class shall go the reserve number. Should the reserve number succeed to a prize and be itself disqualified, the prize will be forfeited.
13. In the event of the owner or the person in charge of an animal, disputing or refusing the award of the judges, the prize awarded will be forfeited. The decision of the judges shall be final. With regard to an animal, any exhibit or any event.
14. The society shall not be responsible for the incorrectness of any entry.
15. The committee shall have the power to exclude any unruly or vicious animal from the showground.
16. All prize-winners in the livestock and horse sections to parade in the Main Ring when called upon to do so by the stewards.
17. The Livestock committee reserve the right to substitute judges where necessary and classes could be amalgamated where there are insufficient entries. Also, to split classes if sufficient entries.

Rules relating to Cattle

18. All livestock exhibited must be the bona-fide property of the exhibitor for 2 months immediately prior to the show.
19. CATTLE ON PARADE: In the interests of safety, there should be no UNAUTHORISED movement of animals during the show period. All cattle will be required to be paraded as directed by the stewards. Stock attendants shall wear white coats or appropriate Society dress at judging and parades. Exhibitors must ensure that sufficient stockmen are available to lead all first, second and third prize winning animals for cattle parades. All handlers must be a minimum of 14 years old on the day of the show for judging of all cattle classes in the MAIN RING. In the interests of safety, all bulls (male cattle not castrated by 10 months of age) must be controlled at all times on the showground through one of the following handling methods: -
 - Two people, one using a bull pole attached to the bull's nose ring and the other using a rope or chain attached to the halter or head chain via the nose ring.
 - Two people both using ropes or chains, one rope or chain attached to a halter, the other either attached directly to the nose ring or via the nose ring to the halter.
 - One person using a bull pole attached to the bull's nose ring and a rope or chain attached to a halter, or head chain via the nose ring, with a competent person standing attached to a halter, or head chain via the nose ring, with a competent person standing by able to assist in the control if necessary.
